



PROXY APPOINTMENT FORM

Who can appoint a proxy?

Pursuant to section 37 of the College's Bylaws, a registrant who is eligible to vote in the election may appoint in writing another registrant as his or her proxy holder to vote in the election or attend and act at the general meeting in the manner, to the extent, and with the power conferred by the proxy. A proxy holder has the same rights as the registrant who appointed him or her to vote in the election or speak at the general meeting.

Pursuant to section 4 of the College's Bylaws, only full or non-practising registrants in good standing are eligible to vote.

How do I appoint a proxy?

Complete the form below and ensure that your proxy holder holds no more than one other registrant's proxy. Under section 37(7) of the College's bylaws, a registrant may hold a maximum of two proxies for any election or general meeting.

Deadline

A proxy must be received by the College at least twenty-four (24) hours before the date of the election or general meeting for which it is executed.
